

# Things to do

### ALOHA STADIUM SWAP MEET

This open-air market is held every Wednesday, Saturday, and Sunday and features over 400 venders selling everything from local crafts to fresh produce.

### MANOA CHOCOLATE FACTORY

Take a tour of this small-batch chocolate factory and learn about the bean-to-bar process while sampling delicious chocolates.

### **DOLE PLANTATION**

Located in Wahiawa, the Dole Plantation offers tours of their pineapple fields, a pineapple maze and a train ride through the property.

### MAKAPUU LIGHTHOUSE TRAIL

This moderate hike offers stunning views of the coastline and the historic Makapuu Lighthouse.

### HONOLULU ZOO

This 42-acrer zoo is home to over 900 animals from around the world, including endangered species like the Komodo dragon and Hawaiian monk Seal.
